ACTIVITIES

Sports (soccer, basketball, volleyball, flag football, cheer, taekwondo, boxing, and track and field)

We emphasize a formative process through which students learn, have fun, compete, and develop their potential. With these sports, they develop skills like strength, speed, stamina, and coordination, as well as values like discipline, commitment, teamwork, respect, resilience, perseverance, emotional regulation, and sportsmanship.

Pro Soccer

This new program, built around differentiation and personalization, transforms soccer classes into a high-performance experience with advanced training, work with specialists, more training time, game recordings, professional analysis, and highly competitive tournaments. This activity is for the 2017, 2018, 2019, and Upper Elementary Girls categories.

Art

A personalized space where children can have guidance as they pursue their interests, refining color, shapes, lines, and composition. Art helps students express themselves, as it uses various languages practiced throughout the year.

Theater

Using the Juilliard Creative Classroom method, students cultivate their oral and physical expression and creativity through recreational activities and a stage play.

Broadway Jazz

Students learn coordination and interpretation tools to create choreography expressed through movement.

Lego

We solve problems with Lego Education materials; students develop social and emotional skills and improve their sequential logical reasoning, fine motor skills, and collaboration. We work with the coding language Scratch for projects.

Robotics

Students learn the difference between machine and robot and learn about electrical concepts. We use electrical engines, mechanisms, series circuits, and parallel circuits. All projects combine ingenuity, intellect, and creativity through coding.

FIRST Robotics

The FIRST technological challenge motto is “more than robotics.” Students make a team of engineers, designers, coders, financial administrators, and project managers. The goal: build a robot in two months to compete against teams all over Mexico.

Activities are run by a team of accredited professionals in the disciplines we offer. Our teachers and coaches are constantly participating in professional development and are passionate about teaching and sharing knowledge.

PRO SOCCER

To take our passion for sports to the next level, we offer the pro soccer team, a program that transforms soccer classes into a high-performance experience.

Comprehensive development

We strengthen discipline, character, teamwork, and leadership.

Advanced training

ADDITIONAL TRAINING DAY

For families who want it, we've included an additional training day a week for **soccer and basketball**. Our goal is to boost students' physical performance and technique by giving them tools that complement their comprehensive athletic education.

- **Day:** Friday
- **Training schedule:** 3:00 to 4:15 p.m.
- **Mealtime:** 2:15 to 3:00 p.m.
- **Required number of students:** at least 15 students per discipline

Participating teams:

- **Soccer:** 1st to 7th grade
- **Basketball:** 3rd to 10th grade

Notes:

1. This training session can include students from different teams.
2. There is no school bus service available for dismissal.
3. This will have an additional cost, and you can sign up during the enrollment or re-enrollment process.



FIRST Robotics is an organization known around the world for fostering STEM education through learning experiences based on real challenges, collaboration, and specialized mentorship.

The program allows students to develop relevant skills useful in both academic and professional environments, further preparing them for careers in engineering, technology, and innovation.

Aside from technical development, the program promotes integral skills like:

- Complex problem solving
- Critical thinking and engineering design
- Coding and automation
- Teamwork and leadership
- Effective communication and project management
- Creativity, resilience, and innovation
- Methodology

Using the official FIRST Robotics model, students will use the workshop to work in multidisciplinary teams to:

- Design, build, and program a robot for competition.
- Take on engineering challenges with an annual theme.
- Document technical and strategic processes.
- Develop collaborative skills and gracious professionalism, one of FIRST's core principles.
- Participate in internationally geared competitions and learning experiences.

RE-ENROLLMENT AND ENROLLMENT

START OF ASP ACTIVITIES

August 31: Early Childhood

September 7: Elementary, Middle, and High School

RE-ENROLLMENT PERIOD

May 18 to 29: Re-enrollment period for the 2026-2027 school year. We will consider the team students played in during the 2025-2026 school year.

ENROLLMENT PERIOD

June 22 to 26: Enrollment period for students joining in the 2026-2027 school year.

PAYMENT

Full Year

(Re-Enrollment)

The full year fee covers the entire school year (September to June). For this option, the school authorizes a payment plan.

- **First payment:** You cover the first 50% of the annual fee when you re-enroll in Eton Online. If this payment isn't made, the registration will not go through and the spot will be made available to other students. **The fee is not automatically added to your tuition payment form.**

- **Second payment:** The remaining 50% is automatically added to the June tuition payment form.

Full Year

(Enrollment)

The full year fee covers the entire school year (September to June) and is paid in its entirety at the time of enrollment in Eton Online. If this payment isn't made, the registration will not go through and the spot will be made available to other students. **The fee is not automatically added to your tuition payment form.**

Semester

- **First semester (September to January):** This payment is made in its entirety at the time of enrollment or re-enrollment in Eton Online. If this payment isn't made, the registration will not go through and the spot will be made available to other students. **The fee is not automatically added to your tuition payment form.**

- **Second semester (February to June):** This payment is automatically added to the January tuition payment form. If you are unenrolling, you must do so in writing before Thursday, December 17, 2026.

Important:

To enroll or re-enroll, you must be up to date with all school payments.

Likewise, the ASP payment should be made in its entirety at the time of enrollment or re-enrollment; otherwise, the registration will not go through and the spot will be made available to other students.

Students will only be considered enrolled when the corresponding payment is made.

PAYMENT POLICIES FOR THE 2026-2027 SCHOOL YEAR

1. Students may attend classes during the new school year only after having paid the fee in full. If a student decides to withdraw from the ASP before September 11, 2026, payments will be refunded, but they cannot be transferred to any other student, including siblings or relatives.
2. Any withdrawals after September 11 of people who paid for the full year will not be eligible for a refund under any circumstance.
3. If your child wishes to switch to a more costly activity, you must pay the difference; alternatively, is they switch to a less costly activity, you will receive the corresponding refund. If you paid for the full year and they decide to switch during the second semester, the price adjustments will be made with the semester fees.
4. All payments will be allocated to the earliest overdue charge, if any. There are no discounts for student absences.
5. Payment options:
 - a) Online, using the Multipagos platform, with:
 - Your wire code (Clabe). Please note that if you use this method, the deadline is on the appointed day at 11:59 a.m.
 - Online BBVA check
 - A credit or debit card (Visa or Mastercard). We also take American Express.
 - b) At the school cashiers with:
 - A check made out to Eton, S.C.
 - A credit or debit card (Visa or Mastercard). We also take American Express.
6. Payments are received pending their processing. If the bank denies the charge for lack of funds, this will incur an additional 10% surcharge plus tax.

7. FOR SECURITY REASONS, THE SCHOOL DOES NOT ACCEPT CASH PAYMENTS.
